### **Sentence**

I bring you good news of great joy for all people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, Christ the Lord.

Luke 2.10–11

### **Collect**

Almighty God,  
who gave your only-begotten Son  
to take our nature upon him

## Isaiah 62: 6-12

Our first reading is taken from Isaiah, Chapter 62 Beginning at Verse 6

<sup>6</sup> Upon your walls, O Jerusalem, I have posted sentinels; all day and all night they shall never be silent. You who remind the LORD, take no rest, <sup>7</sup> and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it renowned throughout the earth. <sup>8</sup> The LORD has sworn by his right hand and by his mighty arm: I will not again give your grain to be food for your enemies, and foreigners shall not drink the wine for which you have laboured; <sup>9</sup> but those who garner it shall eat it and praise the LORD, and those who gather it shall drink it in my holy courts. <sup>10</sup> Go through, go through the gates, prepare the way for the people; build up, build up the highway, clear it of stones, lift up an ensign over the peoples. <sup>11</sup> The LORD has proclaimed to the end of the earth: Say to daughter Zion, See, your salvation comes; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.’ <sup>12</sup> They shall be called, ‘The Holy People, The Redeemed of the LORD’; and you shall be called, ‘Sought Out, A City Not Forsaken.’

## **Psalm: 97**

Our Psalm today comes from Psalm 97. I will read one verse, and I invite you to respond with the next verse,

<sup>1</sup> The Lord is king; let the earth rejoice: let the multitude of islands be glad.

<sup>2</sup> **Clouds and darkness are round about him: righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.**

<sup>3</sup> Fire goes before him: and burns up his enemies on every side.

<sup>4</sup> **His lightnings light the world: the earth sees it and quakes.**

<sup>5</sup> The mountains melt like wax before his face: from before the face of the lord of all the earth.

<sup>6</sup> **The heavens have proclaimed his righteousness: and all peoples have seen his glory.**

<sup>7</sup> They are ashamed, all those who serve idols and glory in mere nothings: all gods bow down before him.

<sup>8</sup> **Zion heard and was glad, and the daughters of Judah rejoiced: because of your judgements, O God.**

<sup>9</sup> For you, Lord, are most high over all the earth: you are exalted far above all Gods.

<sup>10</sup> **The lord loves those that hate evil: the Lord guards the live of the faithful and delivers them from the hand of the ungodly.**

<sup>11</sup> Light dawns for the righteous: and joy for the true of heart.

<sup>12</sup> **Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous: and give thanks to his holy name.**

### **Titus 3: 4-8a**

Our second reading is taken from Titus, Chapter 3, beginning at Verse 4

<sup>4</sup> But when the goodness and loving-kindness of God our Saviour appeared, <sup>5</sup> he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water<sup>[a]</sup> of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. <sup>6</sup> This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Saviour, <sup>7</sup> so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life. <sup>8</sup> The saying is sure.

## **Luke 2: 8-20**

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, Chapter 2, beginning at Verse 8, **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

<sup>8</sup> In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. <sup>9</sup> Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. <sup>10</sup> But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: <sup>11</sup> to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. <sup>12</sup> This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' <sup>13</sup> And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, <sup>14</sup> 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!' <sup>15</sup> When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.' <sup>16</sup> So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in

the manger. <sup>17</sup> When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; <sup>18</sup> and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. <sup>19</sup> But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. <sup>20</sup> The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
