

## Readings for Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> April 2024.

### Sentence

Turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord.

Acts 3.19–20

### Collect

Lord of life,  
by submitting to death, you conquered the grave;  
by being lifted upon the cross, you draw all peoples to you;  
by being raised from the dead,  
you restore to humanity all that was lost through sin:  
be with us in your risen power,  
that in word and deed we may proclaim  
the marvellous mystery of death and resurrection.  
For all praise is yours, now and throughout eternity. **Amen.**

## Acts 3.12-20

Our first reading is taken from the Book of Acts,  
Chapter 3, beginning at verse 12

<sup>12</sup> When Peter saw it, he addressed the people, 'You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk? <sup>13</sup> The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. <sup>14</sup> But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, <sup>15</sup> and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. <sup>16</sup> And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you. <sup>17</sup> 'And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. <sup>18</sup> In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. <sup>19</sup> Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out, <sup>20</sup> so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord, and that he may send the Messiah appointed for you, that is, Jesus,

## Psalm 4

For our Psalm today comes from Psalm 4.

I will read one verse and I invite you to respond with the following verse: -

<sup>1</sup> Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness:  
when I was hard-pressed you set me free;  
be gracious to me now and hear my prayer.

<sup>2</sup> **Children of earth, how long will you turn my glory to  
my shame:  
how long will you love what is worthless  
and seek after lies?**

<sup>3</sup> Know that the Lord has shown me his wonderful  
kindness:  
when I call to the Lord he will hear me.

<sup>4</sup> **Tremble, and do no sin:  
commune with your own heart upon your bed  
and be still.**

<sup>5</sup> Offer the sacrifices that are right:  
and put your trust in the Lord.

<sup>6</sup> **There are many who say ‘Who will show us any good?:  
the light of your countenance, O Lord,  
has gone from us.’**

<sup>7</sup> Yet you have given my heart more gladness:  
that they have when their corn, wine and oil increase.

<sup>8</sup> **In peace I will lie down and sleep:  
for you alone, Lord, make me dwell in safety.**

## 1 John 2.15-17; 3.1-6

Our second reading is taken from the first Letter of Paul to John, Chapter 2, beginning at verse 15

<sup>15</sup> Do not love the world or the things in the world. The love of the Father is not in those who love the world; <sup>16</sup> for all that is in the world—the desire of the flesh, the desire of the eyes, the pride in riches—comes not from the Father but from the world. <sup>17</sup> And the world and its desire are passing away, but those who do the will of God live for ever. <sup>1</sup> See what love the Father has given us, that we should be called children of God; and that is what we are. The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. <sup>2</sup> Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed. What we do know is this: when he is revealed, we will be like him, for we will see him as he is. <sup>3</sup> And all who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure. <sup>4</sup> Everyone who commits sin is guilty of lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. <sup>5</sup> You know that he was revealed to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. <sup>6</sup> No one who abides in him sins; no one who sins has either seen him or known him.

## **Luke 24.36b-48**

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke, chapter 24, beginning at verse 36b, **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

<sup>36</sup> While they were talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' <sup>37</sup> They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. <sup>38</sup> He said to them, 'Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? <sup>39</sup> Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have.' <sup>40</sup> And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. <sup>41</sup> While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' <sup>42</sup> They gave him a piece of broiled fish, <sup>43</sup> and he took it and ate in their presence. <sup>44</sup> Then he said to them, 'These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled.' <sup>45</sup> Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, <sup>46</sup> and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, <sup>47</sup> and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. <sup>48</sup> You are witnesses of these things.

This is the Gospel of the Lord, **praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.**
